Supplies:

Paint:

Any brand of watercolour paint is fine.

The set I recommend for beginners in Mei Liang and it's found on Amazon.ca It doesn't seem to be available at the moment. I got the 36 colour set. The following set is the same set but with extras offered as a kit.

OR you can use any inexpensive watercolour set – for example a kids Crayola set works fine too for cards that will not become heritage items.

Surface:

Paper is SO important. To make it easy on yourself it should have some cotton content.

I'm suggesting Strathmore watercolour cards and envelopes. You can purchase them in Michaels or online – or in another art store.

OR you can get Canson or Strathmore watercolour paper in pads. A 9x12 will make 2 cards for each sheet but then you won't have envelopes. I prefer Strathmore.

Brushes: Can be watercolour brushes or a synthetic brush that you can use for acrylics also.

Large flat – 1" or ¾"
Medium/small flat – 10 or 8 flat
Round #2
Liner #10/0

I like Dynasty Black Gold. Some stores carry them, some don't

Other Materials needed:

Water bucket or plastic tubs – to clean brushes – one side for clean, one for dirty water Grey graphite paper – or make your own by scribbling with a pencil on the back side of a sheet of tracing paper. For watercolour making your own is preferable. The commercial graphite paper is too dark.

Another sheet of tracing paper to trace the patterns onto

Hair dryer

Paper towels

Green painters tape for holding your cards steady as you paint

A piece of corrugated plastic – also found in Michaels in the kid's art section.

OR a hard plastic surface such as you might use to attach drawing paper to. Hardboard is great too.

You need something to mix paint on. A china plate works great or you can purchase small plastic trays for watercolour mixes.


Stylus (optional) for tracing – can use a ballpoint pen




Patterns for all 3 Watercolour patterns
